WORDS FROM FATHER.....A priest at Sacred Heart Major Seminary once said that the time leading up to Thanksgiving can be very wearing and tiresome. The reason behind this is because there really is no break time after Labor Day: the temperature drops and the sun refuses to stick around and *somehow* we are bogged down with all kinds of work and setbacks. Therefore, unless you went trick or treating and was able to stockpile a lot of comfort (junk) food, the months of October and November can be quite the seasonal hurdle to get over. Maybe that is what makes Thanksgiving so special during this time of the year: we get together with family and are able to look back on the memories that we are thankful for. Hence, although Thanksgiving can easily be overshadowed by Halloween and Christmas, it is an important time for reunion, reflection, and rest with loved ones. Speaking of which, I should take this opportunity to announce that **starting this week we will begin having Eucharistic Adoration on Thursdays from 5:30pm to 6:30pm.** Eucharistic Adoration is a time where the Eucharistic Presence of Christ is exposed, and it is a time where Christians can be together with the Lord, opening ourselves to the graces that come from the presence of the Eucharist. In another perspective, it is a time of silent prayer and meditation in the Lord's presence. Therefore, Eucharistic Adoration will provide a time of rest and reflection after our day is done.
