Please call 437-3646/437-5606 (St. Ignatius) or 437-4212(Holy Redeemer) to activate a prayer chain request.

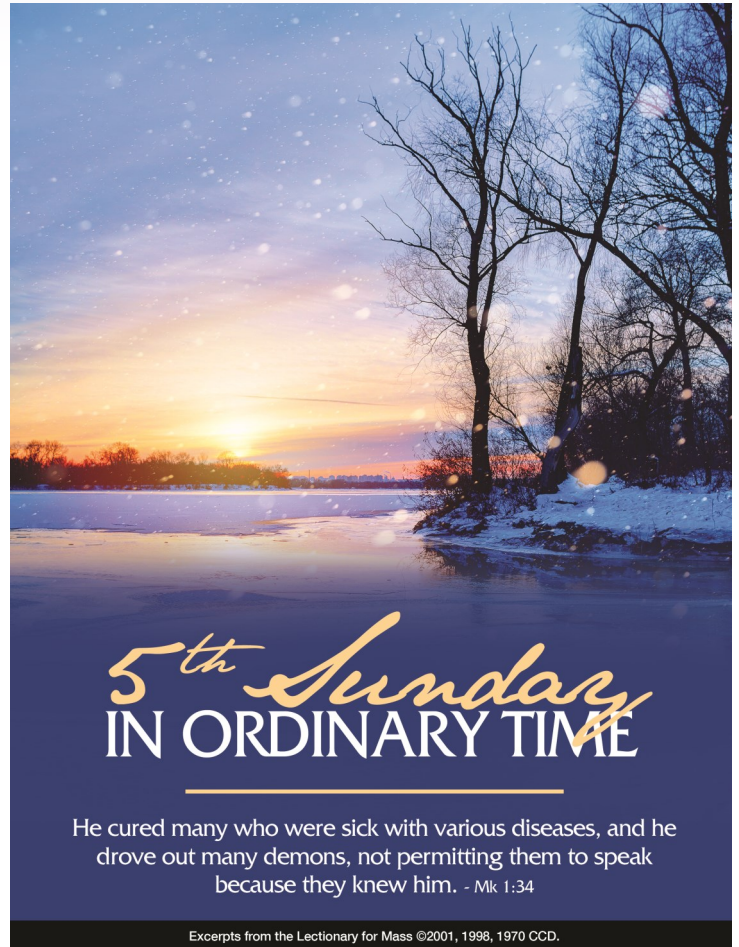
### Mass Intentions

**WORDS FROM FATHER.....** Hello, brothers and sisters. On Saturday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>, we celebrate the memorial of Saint Blaise, bishop and physician. He was originally a doctor who lived during the fourth century. Later, however, he received the Lord's call to become the bishop of Sebastea. There are records that say that Saint Blaise helped patients with illnesses especially with the throat. And this probably explains why he is the patron saint for throat ailments. Yet as he continued his ministry Saint Blaise became more known as "a healer of souls" and this is perhaps because he devoted himself entirely to caring for the Lords' people, thus healing and setting free many souls. Therefore, in memory of Saint Blaise, brothers and sisters, we will have the special Saint Blaise blessing during the Saturday morning mass. Further this blessing will be available after masses on Saturday evening and Sunday morning where the priest blesses the people's throats with two candlesticks (not lit of course). On the other hand, when we reflect on how Saint Blaise is remembered as "healer of souls" we recall how we are meant to be healers who renew the face of the earth, restoring it to its' original beauty that God had intended. Nevertheless, we must also remind ourselves that this is possible not only by our abilities but by God's grace and spirit. Only those who have received the Lord's healing are able to heal others through the power of Christ. Therefore, let us humbly open our hearts to receive Saint Blaise's healing, but above all, to receive the Lord's healing grace so that we too may become healers of souls and heralds of the Gospel.
