Please call 437-3646/437-5606 (St. Ignatius) or 437-4212(Holy Redeemer) to activate a prayer chain request.

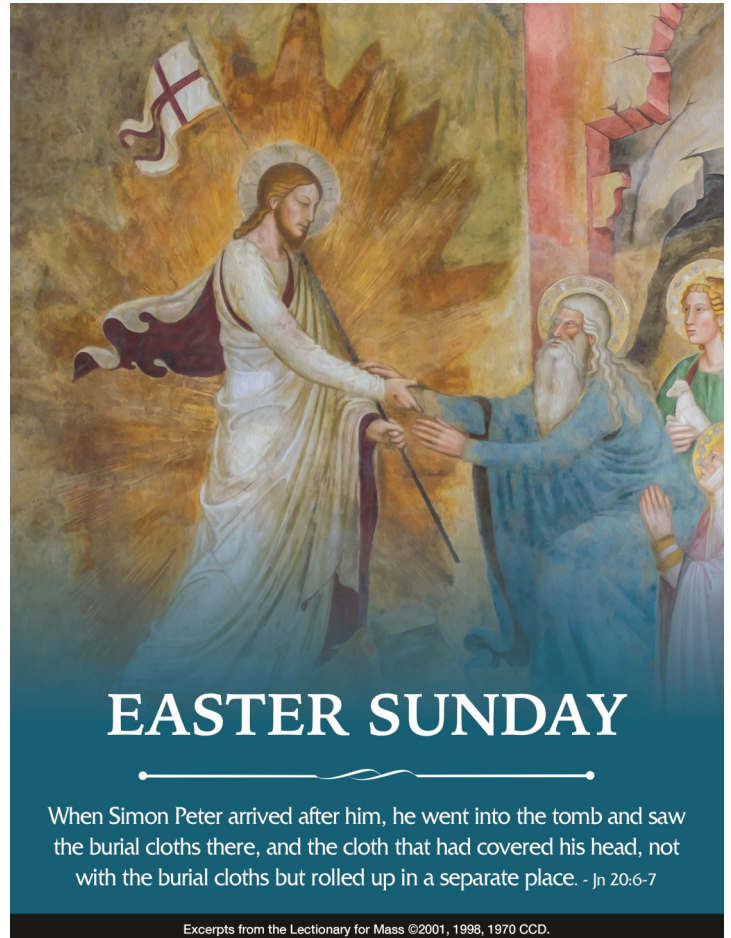
Mass Intentions

WORDS FROM FATHER..... Happy Easter, brothers and sisters. I pray that through this holy day we may receive fully the grace of Our Lord's triumph over death, but moreover that we too – through the resurrection of Christ our Lord – may be born into new life as we enter into the season of Easter. In one sense, Easter celebrates how our Lord defeated death and rose from the grave. Therefore, we as Christians have hope and faith that death is not the end and that we and our loved ones will be reunited in the Kingdom of God. In another sense, Easter helps us realize that since death can no longer imprison God's people nor can any power of evil claim us since we belong to Our Father in Heaven. So this reminds us that for now although we are oppressed and imprisoned by sin and our own weaknesses, we can nevertheless have hope that God who conquered death will certainly conquer all the evils that torment us in this life. Now moving onto another topic it is interesting that on this year Easter Sunday falls on April 1st, which is best known as April Fools Day. This is certainly an ironic coincidence and perhaps those who oppose Christianity might or may have already come up with a good number of jokes. All the more, however, we should remember the words of Saint Paul the apostle in his letter to the Corinthians: "We are fools on Christ's account, but you are wise in Christ; you are weak, but you are strong (1 Corinthians 4:10)." We may appear to be foolish in the eyes of the world but in God's own eyes we are His beloved children. As we receive and trust in His love let us pray that everyone may one day be able to accept Christ resurrected and accept this divine love as well. Father Chahm
