**WORDS FROM FATHER.....** Dear brothers and sisters, as we continue to celebrate the Easter victory of Christ's triumph over death, this Sunday we read about Jesus' reunion with His disciples. Although the disciples had previously abandoned Jesus He appears to them saying, "peace be with you." This greeting indicates that Jesus did not come after His disciples for revenge nor was He simply stopping by. He came so that His disciples could be reconciled with Him and through this reconciliation comes peace. Further, Jesus instructs His friends to "receive the Holy Spirit." When one receives the Holy Spirit it is received so that he or she may now begin their Christian mission to change their heart and to change the world. Hence, after the disciples have experienced reconciliation with the Lord they now receive the Holy Spirit to become reconcilers of the world and thus, builders of a new world. God's gift of peace indeed transforms individuals and communities. But it is possible through the experience of reconciliation. When the disciples were reconciled with the One whom they abandoned on the cross, they forged a new community where no one was abandoned again, where no one lived in fear, and where no one was betrayed. Let us also remind ourselves that we too have received the same Holy Spirit to become reconcilers of the world and builders of communities where peace is meant to overflow. Father Chahm
